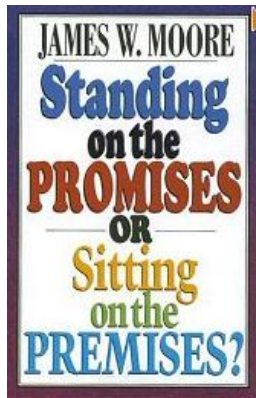

Standing on the Promises or Sitting on the Premises

By James W. Moore

The title itself makes quite a statement. So, knowing we are an active serving Body of Christ should give you a glimpse into what the author wanted to say. Or you might be surprised. If you guessed his message is that we should become first grounded in Christ Jesus and His Truth, you are correct. That is standing on the promises for sure. But, he goes way beyond that.

The book comes complete with a study guide, discussion questions, and activities for the group or individuals to do. I loved reading it for myself, but it would make a good study for a small group. Each chapter discusses a different promise. In the fifteen chapters he covers such things as love, hope, peace, victory, and new life. In essence Moore asks a question; do you claim, embrace, and **celebrate** the great promises of God or sit lifeless and listless as a pew potato? (Pew potato is my term.)

Moore reminds us of the guarantee told again and again of God's promises to His people. It was told to the people of ancient days, again for His people of today, and told again for the future and forever. The Scriptures are full of the generosity of God and the fact that we can lean on a trustworthy Lord. Yet we easily get lost in our petty lives and our faith weakens to complacency.

I am as guilty as anyone and Moore prompted me to be a different kind of Christian. Yes, I believe in God the Father Almighty. Yes, I believe in His Son Jesus Christ. Yes, I believe He returned as the Holy Spirit to dwell within me as my perpetual Guide. But thinking through this book takes me into a place where I know I can undoubtedly rely on Him. Not just for those big deals where I cry out, but in each moment of my day as I sip my tea and read a book...God is there for me.

As I stand firm, rest in God's big arms, I am discovering the richness that He intends for me. I am moved beyond just going to church to begin my week. I am called into making disciples for Him. I am asked to use the spiritual gifts of generosity, encouragement, wisdom, and hospitality to build up anyone within my sphere of influence; my family, my neighbors, my friends, and the Body of Christ. I do not know when I awake each day what that will look like. I just know that I am sheltered in Him, under His wings, and yoked together so that the day will be fully productive for His purpose. So, I choose to **celebrate** my faith...join me.

Child Care Coordinator

The Lexington Emmaus Board of Directors is looking for just the right person to take on the task of arranging child care for our gatherings. In the past year we have had difficulty arranging to have childcare provided at every gathering. Some churches just are not able to supply the childcare even though we will pay them. We have to use child care providers that have been background checked, at least 21 years old and will follow our community policies and those of the UPPER ROOM for Emmaus Communities. If the Lord is speaking to you to fill this need, pray, talk to a board member and take action.

Nominations for New Board Members

The governing body for our community is the Board of Directors. We currently have a 17 member board to lead us into the future. Community members are nominated and elected by secret ballot by the community. The members who are elected serve on the board for a three year term. At the end of that term, new board members are elected for a new three year term. If a board member is appointed to fill out a term that is vacated then they serve the remainder of that term but must be elected to continue on the board.
