From the Lay Director.....

Hello Lexington Emmaus Community,

Calamity. Calamity can come into our lives in many ways. Calamity in large and dramatic ways that affects an entire community or a whole string of communities. Calamity can come into our lives in less dramatic ways, in ways that just affect a very small group of people.

My father passed away in 2007. It was quite the calamity for his family for him to have passed away as young as he was. Dad was a Marine, so he had a military funeral with Marines there to fold an American flag to present to my mother, just like in the movies. I still get teary all these years later when that scene comes up in a movie or TV show.

A while later there was a grief workshop at church. I was still hurting so I went to the workshop. We were encouraged to write a lamentation modeled after the Book of Lamentations in the Old Testament. I wrote out my anger, my disappointments, my hurts, my questions, my disappointed hopes and dreams. It was pretty helpful to put it all down in writing. One of my many questions of God was -- Did you have something to teach me that my Daddy could not?

Turns out the answer to that question was -- Yes. I do have something to teach you.

God reminded me that the closest active duty Marines to my parents' home were a 90-minute drive away on a bright sunny day. The night before Dad's funeral, a good ol' New York blizzard dropped a foot of snow. The family would have understood if the Marines had called and said they could not make it. But they were there. They drove through the aftermath of that 12 in. overnight snowfall. They were there just so they could fold a flag, present it to my mother and turn right around to drive back through the snow again. They were there to honor a man that had worn the same uniform as them. It did not matter that Dad had not worn that uniform since the 60's, long before they all were born. Those Marines were there. Performing their duty. Honoring their commitment to honor my Dad in spite of the adversity presented by 12 in. of snow. They were there. I wish I knew their names.

God said when I ask for your devotion, when I ask you to honor the commitments you have made to Me, I ask you to remember those Marines. Remember their devotion to duty. I ask you to remember those Marines as a model for your devotion to Me.

I have tried to do that ever since.

So my brothers and sisters, I would ask you to do the same in the coming days. We do not yet know what those coming days will be like. God may call you to be the next Billy Graham or Mother Teresa. All God may ever call you to do is to be kind to the person running the cash register or one of the workers in your favorite restaurant. Be kind to refresh their faith in humanity. Be kind to refresh their faith in Christians. I have heard more than once that the worst customers for the Sunday lunch rush in a restaurant are those who have just left church. God may call you to sponsor a pilgrim or two to go on an Emmaus Walk. He may call you to be part of an Emmaus Walk Team. The needs of this world are many. Who knows but Him what you will be called upon to do in His name for His people. I know it can and will be difficult to persevere amongst all the troubles that the world and Satan can send your way. Be devoted to your Lord and Savior, like those Marines were devoted to my Dad. For our Lord and Savior has done far more for you and me than show up for a funeral in the aftermath of a snowstorm.
