

From the Lay Director.....

How often do you think about the roof over your head?

Unless you have a leak, probably not very often. Do you ever think about what keeps it up there? I am an engineer for a fire insurance company, so roofs are probably more in the front of my mind than for most people. If you look up or get into your attic, there are joists and trusses and rafters that the actual roof is attached to. What holds all of those joists and trusses and rafters up there? A lot of the time you can't see them because they are in the walls, but there will be posts and columns and pillars that support all those joists and trusses and rafters that your roof is attached to that keeps the rain out. The whole structure of joists and trusses and rafters collapses without those posts and columns and pillars.

There are at least four pillars that support the Lexington Emmaus Community, or any other Emmaus Community for that matter. Probably more than four, but I will name four. I count prayer, reunion groups, Gatherings and Walks as four pillars that are critical to an Emmaus Community. There have been many times over these past many months as the Lay Director of the Lexington Emmaus Community that I have felt like the whole Community has collapsed upon me. Two of those pillars have been missing for more than a year. It is knowing that prayer is continuing and at least some of our reunion groups are still meeting that have kept me from giving up. Monthly Zoom Gatherings have been happening, but that has just been a 2 x 4 when a good stout 8 x 8 is what is needed. It is very hard to support a four-cornered structure with only two pillars and a very undersized board. But on Friday, June 4, we will be setting a missing pillar back in place. We will have an in-person Gathering at Versailles UMC. Details about that Gathering are elsewhere in this newsletter. When we had Communion time at our first Zoom Gathering, I shed tears of joy being able to share that experience with my Emmaus brothers and sisters. At our May Board of Directors meeting, we discussed whether there would be singing at the June Gathering or not. It would have broken my heart to not sing while we are together. For me, singing is a big part of the joy of coming together. WE WILL SING. And I will likely be in tears. Time will tell, but it is my sincerest hope that we will be able to set the fourth pillar back in place by having Walks in October 2021.

Looking forward so much to seeing you on Friday, June 4. I'll still be in a mask. And as much as I would like to hug and be hugged, it is not yet time for that.
