I took my walk through the Keryx program while in prison in Michigan. Keryx is a program similar to what is known here as Residents Encounter Christ (REC). For me it was a definite life changing experience and continues to guide me even now. Before prison my life was a mess because I was very self-centered seeking all I could for myself. Since my walk I remain more Christ centered seeking more His will than my

We were fortunate enough to be able to meet weekly with outside team members in order to keep our walk experience active. At times I was amazed and awe struck by the faith of those who were actively involved. One specific incident comes to mind. It was at our weekly group meeting that an outside team member brought forth a prayer request concerning a newborn child born with most internal organs all out of place and would be facing an estimated 6-hour surgery to rearrange the internal organs. We immediately called for prayer for this child before continuing with our usual weekly groupings and sharing. A few weeks later we inquired about this child and were told that the Doctors were stunned and amazed when they started the surgery to discover that most of the child's internal organs had shifted into the proper place. The Doctors only required 1-1/2 hours to complete the surgery. This incident alone convinced me that prayer and faith really do work.

There was a definite presence of God among the Keryx family there in prison. I continue with my daily prayers and Bible reading. Despite my past I know I am not the same person I was. It does get difficult at times when people discover that I have a criminal background but tend to judge me for that rather than for my faith and love of God.

I ask the community to pray with me for a reconciliation with my family, especially with my adult children and my grandchildren who do nor know their grandfather. I have not heard anything from them in 20 years and is a struggle at times. I cannot say I don't have my struggles and temptations, but when I turn to God for guidance, direction, and strength I find the burdens to be much less and my path is easier.
