Footprints in the Sand

Last month I shared a little bit about my vacation experiences in the sea and in the mountains. Audible and visual experiences of the two types of vacations are very different. One way they can be the same is walking in the sand. Lots of sand on a beach and as you walk into the ocean flippers and mask in hand. There was plenty of sand in the mountains of Utah too. The only water around in those Utah mountains was in my backpack and trickling down my forehead into my eyes. Some of the trails in Utah required you to scramble across bare rock. You had to hunt for footprints in the sand to figure out which direction the trail went next.

I was walking up a hill in our neighborhood the other day and realized another way that snorkeling in the sea and hiking in the mountains are very different. Weight. Some of those mountain trails, with all those switchbacks, I felt all the weight of my body and everything in my backpack by the time I climbed a couple of hundred feet to the canyon rim. Snorkeling is way different. Once you are in the water, there is no sensation of weight for hours at a time. Coming back onto dry land, feeling weight again, is a very strange sensation. I am sure it is not even close to the sensations that astronauts feel when they return to Earth, but it does give me an inkling of what a return to Earth might feel like.

About two decades ago, I was living through a time of deep emotional and spiritual turmoil. I was barely surviving day-to-day under the weight of the burdens that I felt. There is a poem titled "Footprints in the Sand" that is often seen printed on a wall plaque. I finally remembered that poem. I finally acknowledged that I could no longer do it alone. I reached out to my Lord and asked Him to carry me. I asked that only one set of footprints be left in the sand of my life. He did carry me through my time of trial. After a while I came out the other side, able to walk on my own again. This was before my Walk to Emmaus. I did not have the vocabulary then, back before my Walk to Emmaus, but I was carried through my time of trial by God's grace. Grace I needed before I even knew I needed it. Grace that was available to me before

I even knew I needed it.

That is what we are about as an Emmaus community. God's grace. God's grace and the many ways in which we receive it. God's grace.
